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Welcome to the Silverstone Grand Prix circuit for the sixth weekend of the year for both our GB3 and GB4 Championships, and a busy event for several of our MotorSport Vision Racing series.

The championship battle in GB3 seems to be swaying in the direction of Luke Browning, who took a double win for Hitech just a week ago at Spa-Francorchamps. However, his nearest rival, Fortec's Joel Granfors, was a winner here back in May, and will be out for a similar result this time. Meanwhile Douglas Motorsport's Max Esterson has come on leaps and bounds since his graduation from Formula Ford and he remains in championship contention too.

We have a record 23 GB3 drivers entered this weekend, and I'm delighted that the introduction of the superb new Tatuus MSV-022 car seems to have further strengthened the UK's leading single-seater category!

It's a fascinating scrap at the top of the GB4 standings too, with Hillspeed's Max Marzorati holding a narrow advantage over Fortec's Nikolas Taylor. Taylor has won more races than anyone, but Marzorati's consistency has put him in a good position, and he'll targeting his first win here. Look out too for Kevin Mills Racing's Jarrod Waberski, who has been really impressive in his first season of racing in the UK. GB4 has also given the opportunity for a number of female racers to shine in competitive single-seater racing, and two of them, Megan Gilkes and Logan Hannah, have already won races.

There's a brilliant variety of MSVR championships on offer this weekend, including the GT Cup, which has a massive 40-car grid this weekend. A stunning line-up of supercars will race three times this weekend, with the diverse entry including McLarens, Porsches, Lamborghinis, Ferraris and more.

Additional sports car racing will come from the Radical Challenge and Radical SR1 Cup for Le Mans-style prototypes, and the Porsche Club Championship/911 Challenge. Both categories have impressive grids and will provide exciting action this weekend.

The biggest grid of the weekend comes from the 7 Race Series, with almost 60 Caterhams on the entry list! You can be sure that a pack of cars as big as this around the wide expanses of Silverstone will make for very entertaining viewing.

Meanwhile an eclectic mix of single-seaters will do battle in the Monoposto Championship, with well over 40 cars entered ranging from previousgeneration Formula 3s to Formula Fords and almost anything in-between!

As the race event gets underway, we'd like to extend our thanks to the marshals and volunteer officials, without whom we simply couldn't go racing this weekend, and also wish all our competitors a great weekend of safe and exciting racing.

# Massive GB3 grid set for Silverstone

As many as 23 cars could be in action at Silverstone this weekend, as the GB3 Championship begins its end of season run-in at Silverstone

Following last weekend's dramatic Spa-Francorchamps encounters, the momentum seems to be swinging towards Hitech GP's Luke Browning, who won the first two races of the Belgian triple header and now has five wins to his name this season. Browning was in dominant form at the legendary venue, qualifying half a second clear of the pack on his first ever visit to the venue.

His nearest rival continues to be Fortec's Joel Granfors, a GB3 winner here earlier in the season. The Swede however lost ground at Spa as he finished second to Browning in the first race and then lost another second place after picking up a 10 second penalty in race two. He'll want a repeat of his earlier Silverstone success to apply pressure to the Hitech contender over the remaining rounds.

Douglas Motorsport's Max Esterson has continued to make strong progress in his first year of slicks and wings racing, and sits third having claimed his third podium of the year at Spa.

Carlin's Callum Voisin is a double winner so far and thought he had another victory to his name at Spa, until the final race result was amended. He sits just ahead of his Brazilian teammate Roberto Faria who

occupies fifth place in the standings with nine races to go in 2022.

Tom Lebbon claimed his first single-seater victory at Silverstone earlier this year, and another would allow the Elite Motorsport contender to strengthen his grip on the sixth place he currently occupies.

Following last weekend's dramatic encounters, the momentum seems to be swinging towards Hitech GP's Luke Browning

Next up is JHR's Matthew Rees, who has shown plenty of pace so far and is surely not far from a big result, while Alex Connor was a podium finisher in GB3 last year and will hope to claim his first trophy of the year for Arden at the team's local circuit.

John Bennett continues to show impressive form in his first season of single-seaters and claimed a best result of sixth last weekend while Chris Dittmann Racing's McKenzy Cresswell claimed his first podium of the season at Spa and completes the top-10 heading to the home of the British Grand Prix.

Javier Sagrera (Carlin) and JHR's recent recruit James Hedley are separated by just a handful of points and ahead of CDR's Branden Oxley who enjoyed his most competitive weekend of the year at Spa with a podium and a front row start.

Hitech's Bryce Aron claimed his first GB3 podium at Silverstone and has since followed that up with a win at Donington, while Douglas Motorsport's Tommy Smith became the ninth different driver to claim a winner's trophy with his race three success at Spa.

Nick Gilkes was oh so close to a Silverstone victory earlier this year, so will hope to find that sort of form again for Hillspeed, while Fortec's Zak Taylor heads to Silverstone buoyed by his first podium result in GB3.

Marcos Flack delivered a trio of top-10 finishes at Spa for Douglas Motorsport on his best showing of the year, while the master of the reverse, Fortec's Mikkel Grundtvig, will be out to create more magic this weekend

Cian Shields took his first car racing victory at Silverstone so will be optimistic this weekend, while it's hoped David Morales will be on the grid after emerging unscathed from a frightening 140mph shunt at Spa last weekend.





His Arden teammate Nico Christodoulou is gearing up for his first ever Silverstone appearance, while the grid is bolstered by the arrival of American Ayrton Ori, who increases Chris Dittmann Racing's line-up to a full three-car line-up this weekend.

As is usual, GB3 will race three times this weekend, with qualifying determining the starting grid for race one which starts at 14.15 on Saturday, and race two, which is due to commence at 09.35 on Sunday morning. The final race, the always entertaining reverse grid race three, will start at 15.00 on Sunday afternoon

All three races will be streamed live on the official GB3 website, Facebook page and the MSV TV YouTube channel, with presenter Jon Jackson and the commentary team of Lewis McGlade and Piers Prior. For more championship information, visit www.gb-3.net.

GB4 title race set for Silverstone

The ever-tightening GB4 Championship title race heads to the Silverstone Grand Prix circuit for the second time in its inaugural season, with three drivers separated by just 30 points at the head of the standings.

The return to Silverstone promises much excitement, given the slipstreaming thrillers that were delivered at the circuit back in May. Back then, there were multiple lead changes in each race, and astonishing pack racing from a tightly matched field of hungry young racers gunning for a £50,000 end of year prize for the maiden champion.

The field is headed by Hillspeed's Max Marzorati, the 21-year-old Brit has been a model of consistency in GB4 this year, with a total of eight podiums to his name from the 15 races held so far. Marzorati's story is a remarkable one given he had all but given up on his racing aspirations

this time last year, only to sign a last minute deal with the Markham Vale-based team to contest GB4 this year.

That supreme consistency has put him nine points ahead of Nikolas Taylor, Fortec's Malaysian-British contender who entered GB4 off the back of only around a dozen kart races, but has since won more races than any other driver this year with five to his name already. He's led the championship on several occasions too, and won two of the three Silverstone races earlier this year. He'll be out for more of the same this weekend.

Meanwhile, an excellent weekend for Kevin Mills





Racing's Jarrod Waberski at Snetterton has fired the South African firmly into the title race. A big points haul, which included a win and a second place means he's only 21-points behind Taylor and within 30 of Marzorati. He's taken a podium at every event this year, so expect more of the same as he continues to edge closer to the leaders.

Elite's Jack Sherwood is another driver to have hit

impressive form in recent weeks. The 16-year-old has taken six podiums from the last seven races, and won his first single-seater contest at the Snetterton finale to put him up to fourth in the standings. He's 60 points away from the championship lead, but with his current form, he could well be a championship dark horse and definitely a win contender again at Silverstone.

Kevin Mills Racing's Tom Mills enjoyed a return to form at Snetterton with his first podium since Oulton Park, and also showed an impressive turn of form by qualifying on the front row. A first GB4 win is certainly beckoning, and it should be remembered too that he managed to go from fourth to the lead at Silverstone in the space of two corners the last time GB4 raced here.

Hillspeed's Megan Gilkes has proven her ability this year with two wins so far, with one at the first ever meeting at Snetterton in April, and a dominant triumph at Donington at the end of May. She's aiming to go one better than her previous best Silverstone result of fourth earlier this year.

Graham Brunton Racing's Logan Hannah claimed her first podium of the year at Silverstone, and followed that up with a spectacular triumph at Donington Park to claim her first slicks and wings victory. Getting closer to the pace with each event, the Scottish contender will be aiming to lead again at the home of the British Grand Prix.

Fortec's Jessica Edgar is another to have taken a podium this year courtesy of a second place finish at Oulton Park, and she's edged closer to the pace on each weekend since then as she continues to learn in her first season since graduating from karting.

Hannah's teammate Chloe Grant is another to have made impressive progress this year. The former Junior Saloon Car racer is in her first year of single-seater racing and has gained plenty of pace as the year goes on, having qualified within the 103% mark of pole position at the past three events, with faster times on each occasion.

Christian Lester returns to the grid this weekend with Rossoverde Racing, having missed the recent Snetterton round. Lester has also made big improvements and





qualified within 103% of pole at Donington Park, giving him reverse grid pole there. Should he do the same at Silverstone, he'll be aiming for a season's best result.

Meanwhile, there's a new name on the grid in the form of Marcus Short, the 17-year-old son of successful endurance racer Martin. The youngster has raced Citroen C1s, and in the MG Cup, and now makes his single-seater debut with Hillspeed having made a name for himself in esports too.

GB4 will have another triple header this weekend, with qualifying deciding the starting grid for race one which starts at 17.30 on Saturday, and race two, which is due to commence at 11.40 on Sunday morning. The final race, the always dramatic reverse grid race three, will start at 16.05 on Sunday afternoon.

All three races will be streamed live on the official GB4 website, Facebook page and the MSV TV YouTube channel, with presenter Jon Jackson and the commentary team of Lewis McGlade and Piers Prior. For more championship information, visit www.gb-4.net.

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




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







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The first of the championship's groups, Group GTO is the Open Specification group and Raw Motorsport's Radical RXC leads the points tables following a brilliant start to the season for Steve Burgess and Ben Dimmack. Challenging them for points will be Richard Chamberlain's unique Porsche 935 – the bright orange machine will be easy to spot on the grid.

Group GT3 does exactly what it says on the tin and hosts cars homologated to manufacturer's GT3 specification. Currently leading the standings (and currently second in the overall title fight) is the pairing of Simon Orange and Michael O'Brien in their McLaren 720S GT3. Behind them is Morgan Tillbrook and Marcus Clutton of Enduro Motorsport, also in a McLaren 720S GT3. In fact, McLaren



Challenge cars find their home in Group GTC and this weekend the group features machinery from Ferrari, Lamborghini, Porsche and Ginetta. Lucky Khera and pro partner David Macdonald have had a cracking season so far and are currently find themselves at the top of the standings. A pair of Lamborghinis from Topcats with HEX.com sit second and third in the points and will be looking to close the gap.

Group GTH remains the largest and most competitive with 15 entries lining up on the grid and featuring cars from Mercedes, McLaren and Porsche. Valluga Racing's James Wallis and Sam Maher-Loughnan currently lead the title fight ahead of Makehappenracing's Stephen Walton and Chris Hart. Third and fourth in the title are only two points apart, so keep an eye on the #26 Paddock Motorsport and the #77 Greystone GT McLarens as they have their own points battle to contend.





Plenty of invitational entries this weekend bring Groups GTB and GTA back onto the grid this weekend. GT Cup regulars Saxon Motorsport and Whitebridge Motorsport will both be running BMWs in Group GTB, with a Ferrari Challenge 458 and a non-GT4 homologated McLaren 570S completing the group. JMH Automotive will be running the sole entrant in Group GTA – a Ginetta G55 with Paul Maxfield and Conor Flynn behind the wheel.

## RADICAL CHALLENGE CHAMPIONSHIP AND RADICAL SR1 CUP





With a number of different winners across the past three rounds, this season is turning out to be an exciting one to watch. Many of the past champions return this week to take their next podium, as well as a grid full of local and international competitors – from rookie to Radical veteran.



The Radical Challenge Championship continues as a mix of two sprint races on Saturday, followed by a longer endurance race on the Sunday. This format supports both solo and 2-driver teams who can share the race time equally.

In-line with Radical's other international championships, the Challenge includes the *Masters Class* which features the awesome turbocharged Radical SR10 which will once again be powered by Radical veteran driver from the United States – Jim Booth, as well as the SR8, RXC and RXC Spyder models

invited to join the grid. Solo drivers and driver teams can continue to contest the longstanding Supersport class for SR3's of all generations.

The 21st season of the Challenge is already a close one. Rounds one and two saw six different race winners across the six races, whilst the third round at Snetterton last month saw James Lay of RAW Motorsports dominate the weekend's racing, with two poles and three race wins. Title-fighters Anthony Ayres and Noah Degnbol supported him on the podium to keep their title charge in place. This weekend we welcome back returning names and faces all wanting to make their way to the top step of the podium. The Radical Works Team will also be supporting the Radical Cup North America 1500 Champion – Gustavo Rafols, as he joins the grid for his first international race.

#### **Radical SR1 Cup**

The SR1 Cup will consist of the usual and popular format, but will also host the 45 minute endurance race as part of the championship, giving all competitors a good opportunity to gain valuable championship points.





2022 has already seen a fierce battle between Daryl De Leon and Ben Caisley – both driving their first full SR1 Cup season this year. Daryl De Leon, supported by Valour Racing, shone at the previous round, with a pole position and two race wins, leaving Ben Caisley with DW Racing hungry to get back onto the top step of the podium. Tom Wood from the University of Derby team joins for the remainder of the season after a couple rounds away, and new driver Tom Fleming looks to make his debut in his Radical SR1.

The tenth season of Radical's highly rated entry-level championship continues to offer the best way for motorsport fans to start their own racing path. While being Radical's 'entry level race car', the SR1 is a full-on purposebuilt race car generating lap times faster than cars costing three times as much.

Both the SR1 Cup and Radical Challenge meet again ¬¬ at Oulton Park for round five in the middle of next month.

## PORSCHE CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP / 911 CHALLENGE





The biggest group of cars comes from the Porsche Club Championship where the two classes are competing for the prestigious title as their season enters its second half. The quickest class one cars could be challenging for outright race honours with their slick tyres giving them a speed advantage in the corners.

2020 champion Simon Clark has been the pacesetter in recent races in his 996 C2, but he will be pushed hard by experienced racers such as Pete Morris, Chris Dyer and Kevin Harrison. Father and Son duo James and Bill Caley have also been front-runners in what has been a close season to date, Bill impressing having stepped up from class two.

Class two is dominated by Boxsters and has also seen some great racing so far, with a clutch of quick drivers fighting for the podium places. James Coleman and Colin Tester have taken the race wins, while Angus Archer, Paul Simpson and Andrew Porter have all taken podium finishes and they will all be looking to claim a win on the full Silverstone layout.

The Boxster Cup features similar cars but running on treaded tyres to control costs, and has an intriguing mix of relative race newcomers and drivers with a couple of seasons under their belts. Mike Thompson heads the points having only once finished off the podium, while Pete Evans is the form driver having taken the last three wins.

A host of rookies have shown their strength with Darren Labbett and Darren King both winning races with a novice cross on the back of their cars, Stephen Shore also taking his first win. Our two lady racers are also both overdue podium finishes, Sarah Thomson





taking both poles at Snetterton while Faye Noble-Evans is always in the thick of the action.



**1600** - a class combining the 270R, 310R and the older Supersport cars. All utilising the 1.6 Ford engine albeit the 310R taking a slight advantage with the variable cam timing version of the engine and a Mazda gearbox, compared to the Ford gearbox found on the older Supersport. Engines are sealed by Caterham or McMillan Motorsport.

All classes use the fantastic Toyo R888R GG compound tyres that offer excellent grip levels in both wet and dry conditions, while being affordable, durable and readily available.

This meeting marks the start of the second half of the Monoposto Championship with all our drivers coming together on one big grid of cars on the Silverstone GP Circuit.

In the Mono F3 class, Tony Bishop has had a good season so far, taking four of the seven wins, five fastest laps and not yet finishing a race off the podium. His nearest rival in the championship, Ashley Dibden, will not be out this weekend but don't expect it to be plain sailing for Tony as he will be joined by several very quick competitors in this big class of twelve cars.

The Moto 1000 class has another big entry of twelve cars for this meeting. Mark Betts is leading the class by what seems like a large margin, but he has not yet missed any rounds or suffered any DNFs so with dropped scores considered, he is equal in the standings with Billy Styles. They will be joined by the three Leastone cars who have all been on the podium multiple times this season, as well as a swarm of Jedis.

Terry Clark is leading the Mono 2000 class by a fair margin, but when dropped scores are considered, previous champion Mat Jordan isn't far behind. James Rimmer and Robin Dawe who are also previous champions in this class will be out this weekend as well which should make it a close battle for the class wins.

Jim Spencer is currently leading the Mono Classic 2000 class but with him unable to attend this weekend, it gives opportunity for others to close up to him in the championship. Previous champion Eddie Guest is currently second; he will be joined my multiple champion Jared Wood and the current third place sitter Nick Catanzaro. Will Cox will be joining the class this weekend in the Jim Blockley Ralt RT3 which has seen many a class and championship win in its time, Will too is a previous champion of the 1600 class so he will be one to watch as he graduates to the Classic championship.

Phil Davis is leading the Mono 1800 class having had





a successful season so far. Tom Wheatley on the other hand has had a dramatic season so far, seemingly either winning or breaking down. He currently sits fourth in the championship but will be hoping for some reliability to help him climb up the order.

The Mono 1600 class has once again been dominated by Geoff Fern so far this season, having taken all but one win, one second place and four fastest laps. Kyle Wallace is in second place in the championship. Having only started racing at the end of last season, he has been gaining speed and getting closer to Geoff at every race meeting and even taken a couple of fastest laps from him, will this be the one where he can beat him?

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The GB3 (hampionship is aimed at young drivers targeting a future step up to FIA F3 from FIA F4 championships, and experienced karters looking for their first taste of single-seater racing.

#### SPECIFICATION

The brand new Tatuus MSV-022 single-seater cars are completely identical and are powered by a 2-litre Mountune engine producing a 250bhp. The new car has a significant increase in downforce of around 25% compared to the previous model.

The cars feature a highly adjustable front-wing and two-piece rear wing, and an F1-style front splitter and rear diffuser, plus a drastically revised aerodynamics package. It features a six-speed sequential gearbox with paddle shift provided by Sadev and fitted with a limited-slip differential, unique to GB3. Tyres are provided by Pirelli.

The new cars meet contemporary FIA criteria, including the addition of the halo, improved side impact protection and anti-intrusion panels.

#### **WEEKEND FORMAT**

This weekend features one qualifying session and 3 races each 12 laps (max 20 mins) in length. The grid for the first race will be based on qualifying order, while each driver's second fastest time from the session will determine the grid for race two. The race three starting order will be the reverse order of the fastest times achieved in qualifying prior to any penalties applied during or following qualifying. To be included in the reversal, each driver's fastest lap time in qualifying needs to be within 103% of the overall fastest lap.

#### **POINTS**

Points are awarded in races 1 and 2 of each weekend as follows: 35-29-24-21-19-17-15-13-12-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1 to the top 20 finishers. Points are awarded in race 3 of each weekend as follows: 20-17-15-13-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1, with points also awarded for positions gained in the race. So for example, if a driver started eighth and finished first, they would gain a total of 27 points.



The cars feature adjustable front and rear wings, and a six-speed sequential gearbox with paddle shift provided by Sadev with Magneti Marelli electronics. Tyres are provided by Pirelli.

The car includes FIA-approved carbon fibre front and rear impact structures, side impact panels and HANS-compliant FIA head restraints.

This weekend features one qualifying session and 3 races. The qualifying duration is 15 minutes and the races are 18 minutes in length. The grid for the first race will be based on qualifying order, while each driver's second fastest time from the session will determine the grid for race two. To be included in the reversal, each driver's fastest lap time in qualifying needs to be within 103% of the overall fastest lap.

Points are awarded in race 3 of each weekend as follows: 20-17-15-13-11-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1, with points also awarded for positions gained in the race. So for example, if a driver started eighth and finished first, they would gain a total of 27 points.

A complete car including engine, costs £28,500 plus VAT if purchased from MSV. Parts are also very competitively priced.



Additionally, each competitor will score bonus points equal to the number of starters in the relevant class but not exceeding a maximum of 10, ie 10 starters or more 10 bonus points (per competitor), 9 starters 9 bonus points, 8 starters 8 bonus points etc.

To determine the final Championship points total a driver will count his/her total number of points scored from the maximum number of qualifying races, less 2 races. Subject to any disciplinary finding, non scores may be included as lowest scores.

#### **ENQUIRY OFFICE**


